

Rationalize Packaging Requirements	Activity: Work toward harmonizing pack sizes, bundling, branding, bar coding requirements Progress: Currently assessing packaging requirements between USG and UN Result: Market efficiencies, more competitive bidding, bulk procurement for social marketing
Incentivize Product Registration	Activity: Create an internal team to focus on developing strategies for incentivizing registration Progress : Developed hypothesis on major barriers for suppliers related to the country registration Result : Improved and sustained access to quality-assured product in as many countries as possible
Simplify and Decouple the RFP Process	Activity: Move to IDIQ frameworks for many product categories which provides decoupling benefits Progress: 4 of 6 FP/RH methods are under an IDIQ type of procurement Result: Streamline bidding and evaluation, encourage more bidders to enter market, reduce lead time














DMPA IM: DEMAND FORECAST


